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1. Introduction.

NyayShruti is an integrated digital platform that enables secure and efficient **Virtual Court proceedings** among stakeholders of the **Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS)**. Its integration with **CCTNS** allows Police Officers to access Virtual Court hearing information directly from the existing CCTNS application, eliminating the need for separate login credentials and improving operational efficiency.

Using this functionality, Police Officers can:

- View scheduled Virtual Court (VC) hearing details.
- Verify hearing schedules before the production of accused persons.
- Check the assigned Court, Presiding Judge, hearing date, and scheduled time.
- Prepare accused persons for Video Conferencing proceedings.
- Coordinate effectively with Courts, Prisons, Prosecution, and other ICJS stakeholders.
- Ensure the timely production of accused persons and improve inter-agency coordination..

This manual explains how authorized Police Officers can securely access and view the **Virtual Court (VC) Hearing List** through the **CCTNS** portal.

2. CCTNS Overview

NyayShruti is a secure Virtual Court and Video Conferencing platform designed to facilitate seamless communication and virtual hearings among stakeholders of the criminal justice system. It enables Courts, Police, Prisons, Prosecution, Forensic Science Laboratories (FSLs), and other authorized agencies to participate in court proceedings remotely, ensuring timely and efficient judicial processes while reducing the need for physical transportation of accused persons and witnesses.

The **Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems (CCTNS)** is a flagship e-Governance initiative of the **Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Government of India**, implemented by the **National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB)**. CCTNS provides an integrated digital platform for police departments across the country to manage crime records, investigations, police administration, and law enforcement activities through a centralized information system.

The integration of **NyayShruti** with **CCTNS** enables authorized police officers to directly access the **NyayShruti Police Video Conferencing Dashboard** using their existing CCTNS credentials. This integration eliminates the need for separate login credentials and provides officers with a unified interface to view Virtual Court (VC) hearing schedules, access hearing details, and coordinate with courts and other criminal justice stakeholders.

Using the NyayShruti dashboard, police officers can:



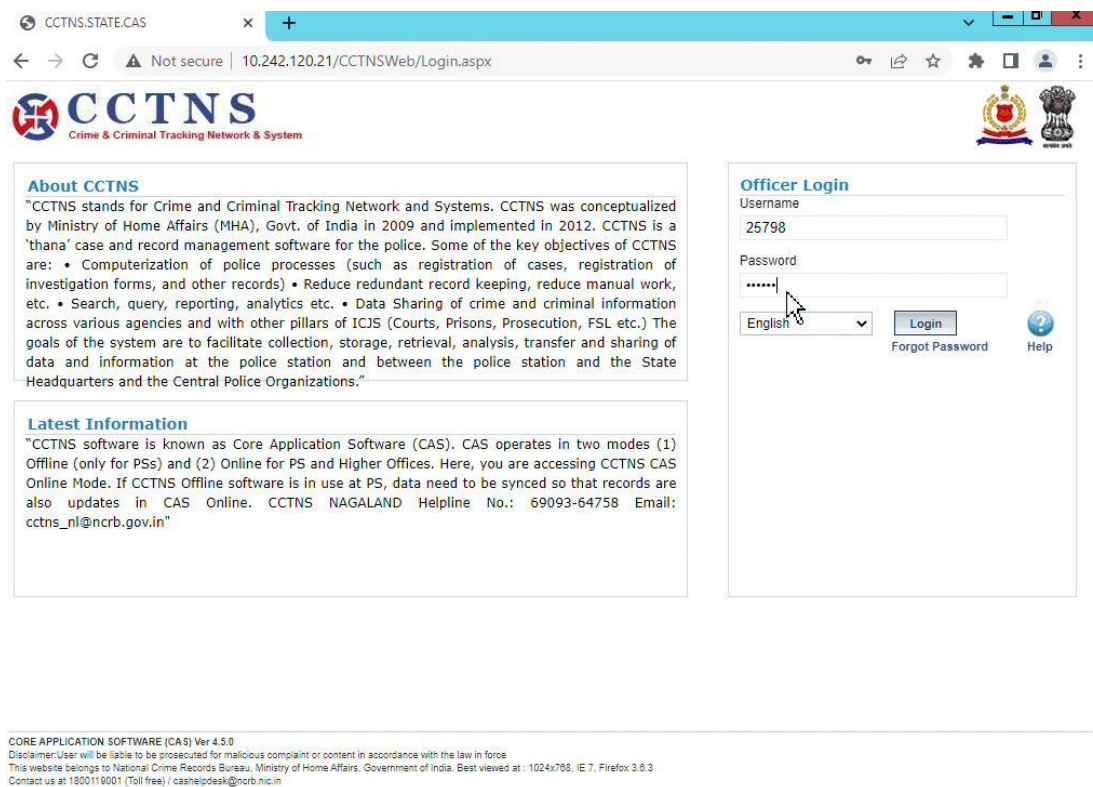
- View scheduled Virtual Court (VC) hearings for their Police Station.
- Search hearings by Police Station and hearing date.
- Verify the assigned Court and Presiding Judge.
- Prepare accused persons for virtual production before the Court.
- Improve coordination with Courts, Prisons, Prosecution, and other ICJS stakeholders.
- Ensure timely participation in virtual court proceedings and minimize operational delays.

This user manual provides detailed, step-by-step instructions for accessing the NyayShruti Police Video Conferencing Dashboard through the CCTNS portal, viewing the Virtual Court Hearing List, and understanding the information displayed for efficient day-to-day operations.

3. Step-by-Step Process

Step 1: Open the CCTNS Portal

Example: Open Google Chrome and go to the CCTNS login page (e.g. 10.242.120.21/CCTNSWeb/Login.aspx). The CCTNS home page loads, showing information about CCTNS on the left and the "Officer Login" panel on the right.



About CCTNS
 "CCTNS stands for Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems. CCTNS was conceptualized by Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Govt. of India in 2009 and implemented in 2012. CCTNS is a 'thana' case and record management software for the police. Some of the key objectives of CCTNS are: • Computerization of police processes (such as registration of cases, registration of investigation forms, and other records) • Reduce redundant record keeping, reduce manual work, etc. • Search, query, reporting, analytics etc. • Data Sharing of crime and criminal information across various agencies and with other pillars of ICJS (Courts, Prisons, Prosecution, FSL etc.) The goals of the system are to facilitate collection, storage, retrieval, analysis, transfer and sharing of data and information at the police station and between the police station and the State Headquarters and the Central Police Organizations."

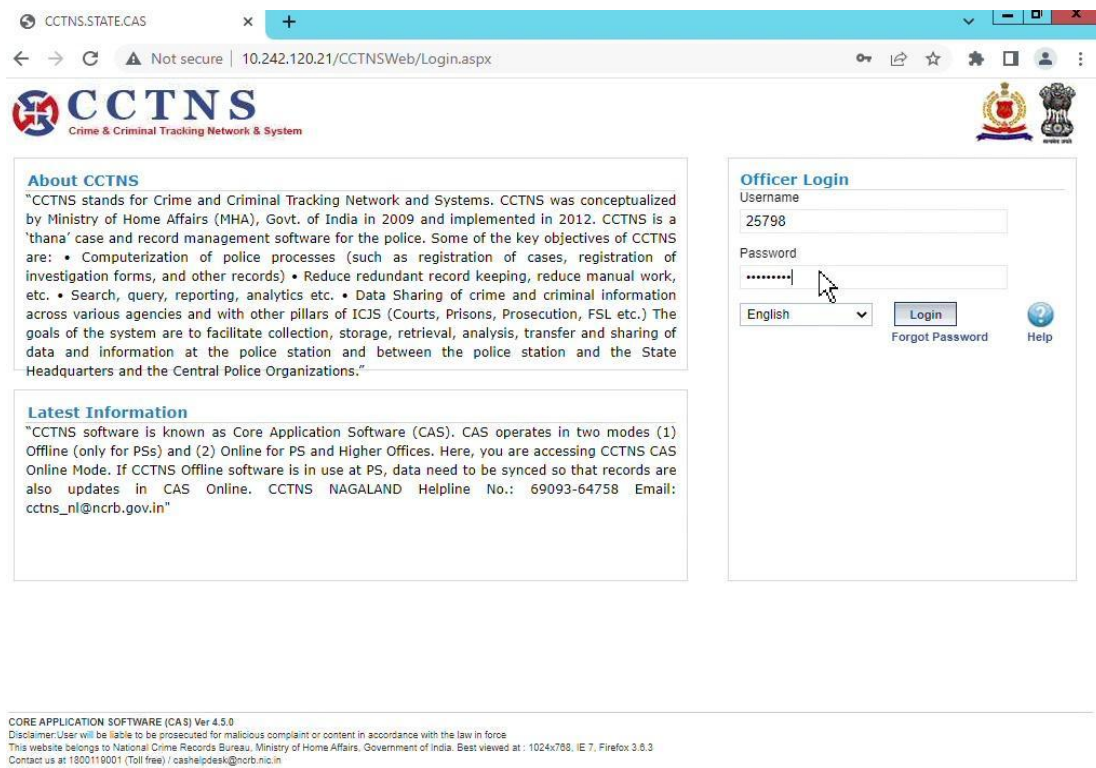
Fig 1: CCTNS Login page

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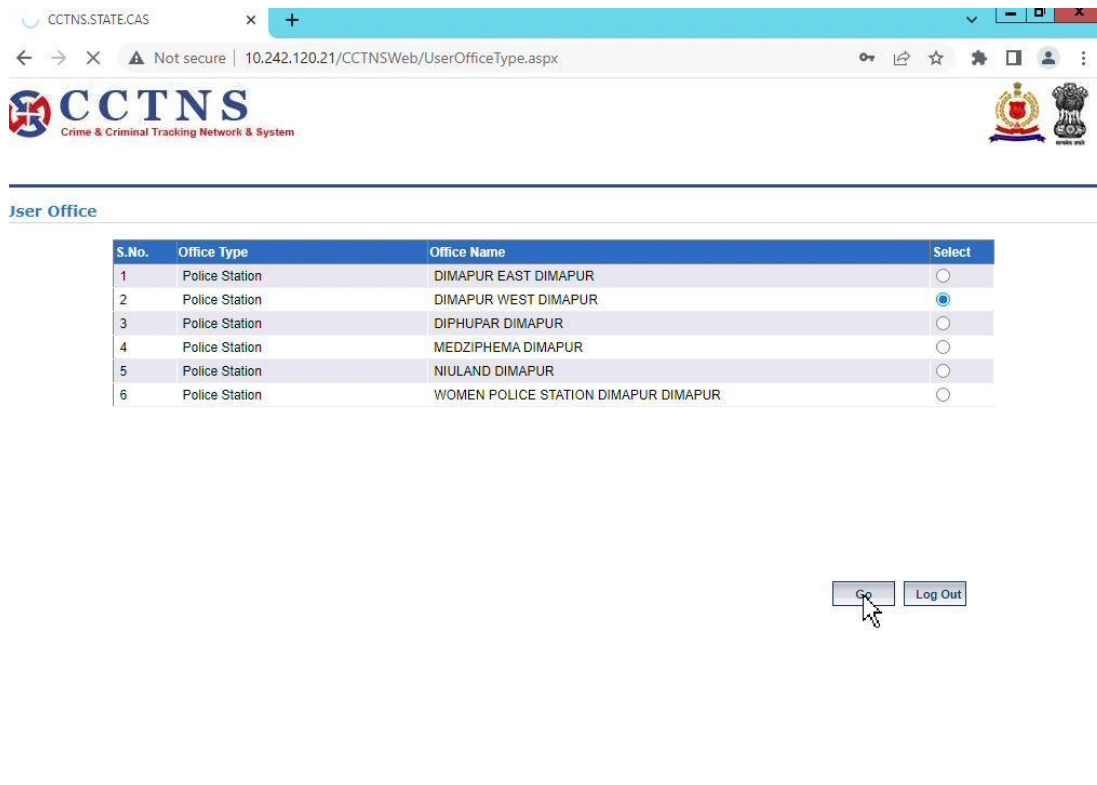

Step 3: Select User Office (Police Station)

After logging in, the "User Office" page appears, listing the Police Stations/offices linked to your login. Select the radio button next to the correct Office Name (e.g. DIMAPUR WEST DIMAPUR), then click the "Go" button.

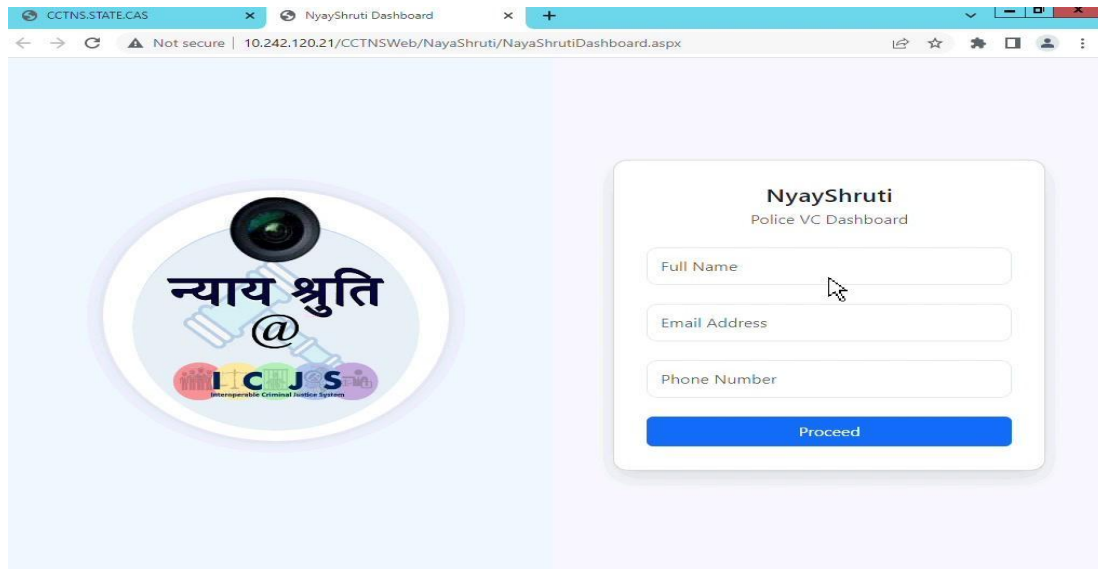
Fig 3: Selecting the Police Station and clicking Go

The system opens a new tab for the "NyayShruti – Police VC Dashboard". Fill in the short form:

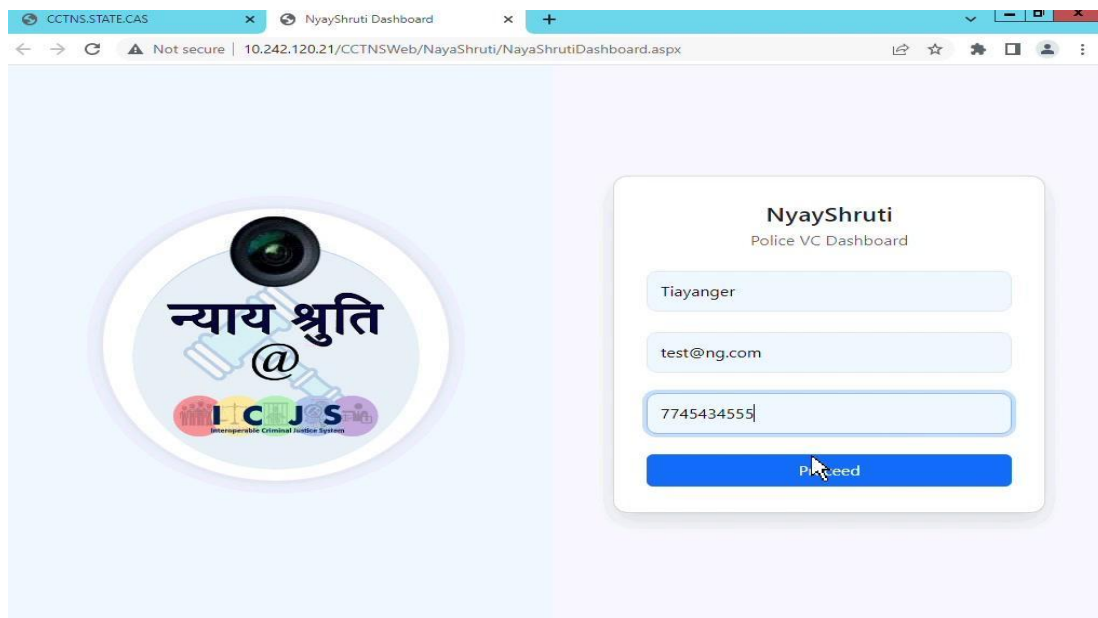
- Full Name

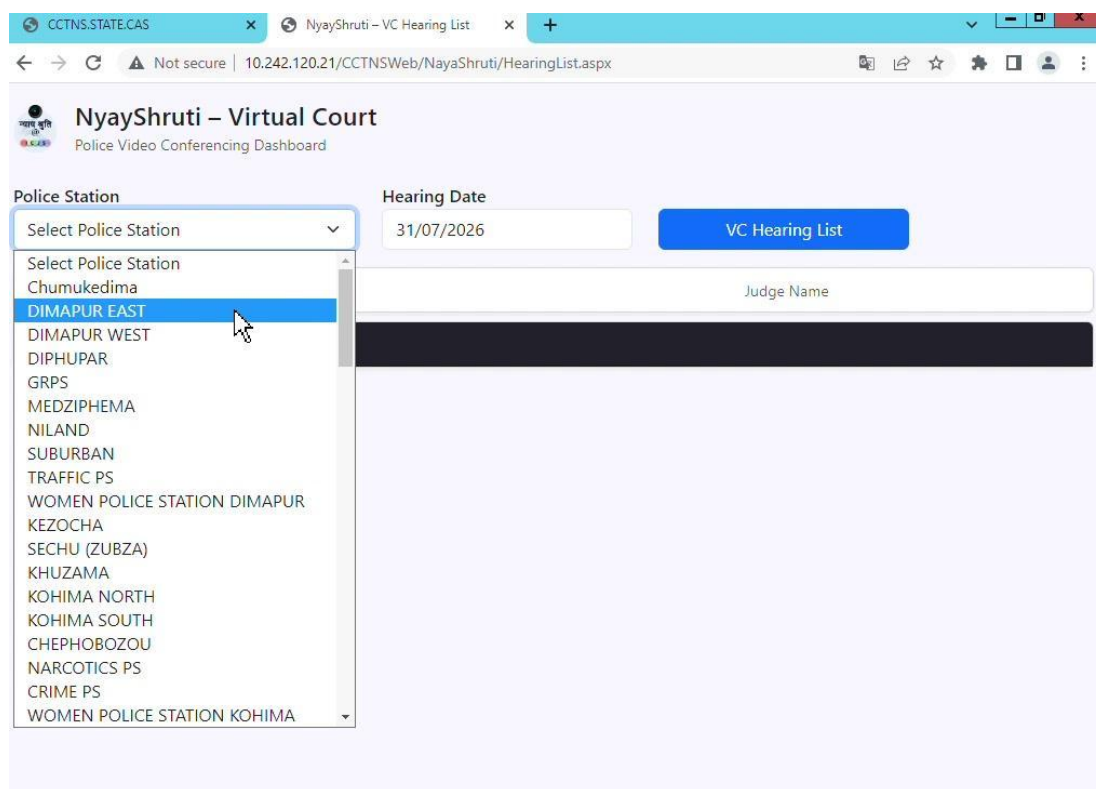

Step 5: Select Police Station and Hearing Date

On the "NyayShruti – Virtual Court / Police Video Conferencing Dashboard" page:

- Click the "Police Station" drop-down and choose the required station from the list (e.g. Dimapur East, Dimapur West, Diphupar, Medziphema, Niland, Kohima North, Kohima South, etc.).
- Confirm or change the "Hearing Date" field (defaults to today's date).

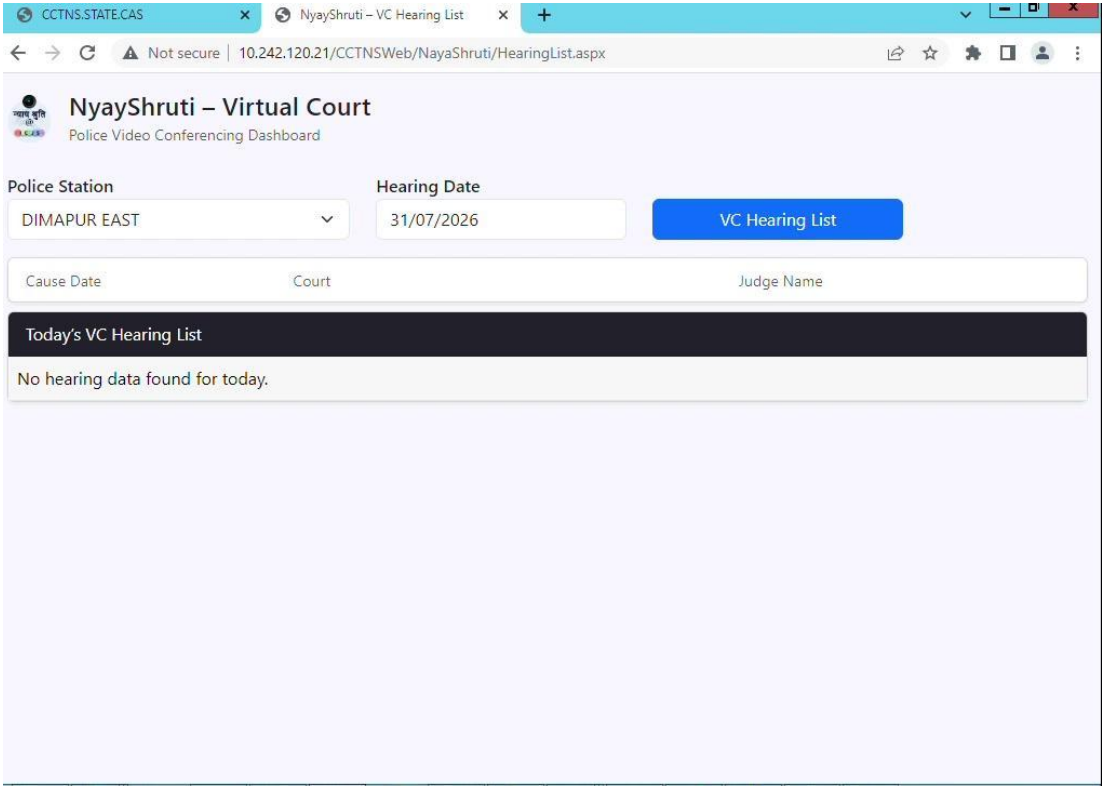

Step 6: View the VC Hearing List
